


Overview of Judge O'Connor's cases

Total number of Cases before the Court	148
DMROs Granted	74

What was the outcome in the other 74 cases?

- Cases adjourned to get updated proofs.
 - Average number of court appearances per DMRO granted = 1.97
- Cases withdrawn as the Relevant Person passes away before final orders.
- Ex parte consent applications granted but Capacity Application not lodged.
- Cases withdrawn of the parties' own motion as co-decision-making agreement is more appropriate route.


Ex Parte Consent Applications




- Thus far, 30% of cases before the Court required the consent of the Court before issuing the Capacity Application.
- Applications made by or on behalf of the HSE/Hospitals account for 9% of the total number of cases.
- Other groups:
 - Siblings
 - Parents of adult children
 - Nieces and nephews

Nursing Home Support Scheme


Of the 148 cases before the Court, 109 cases seek orders relating to the Nursing Home Support Scheme.




Section 139 of the Act – the Relevant Person shall attend Court



Legal Representation - Applicant




Legal Representation – Relevant Person



- This data set is per DMRO granted since commencement.
- However, in recent times we have seen an increase in the number of cases where the Relevant Person is legally represented.
- Taking the past 20 DMROs granted, the percentage of cases where the Relevant Person was legal represented rises from 38% (as seen in the pie chart) to 55%.
