Section B: Information Specific to Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (PHECC)

registered Vaccinators (Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT), Paramedics and Advanced Paramedics) for the administration of the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) live for Health Service Executive (HSE) MMR catch-up vaccination programme and in the event of an outbreak

Statutory Instruments No. 422 of 2023 enables health care professionals (including Registered EMT, Paramedics and Advanced Paramedics) who are vaccinators as professions that can administer Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) live vaccine as part of an HSE vaccination programme.

In order to administer the vaccine, PHECC registered Vaccinators (EMT, Paramedics and Advanced Paramedics) **must read and understand** the medicine protocol for the administration of the MMR vaccine.

PHECC registered Vaccinators (EMT, Paramedics and Advanced Paramedics) shall **complete the Self-Assessment of Competency Form** included in this section. The medicine protocol and the Self-Assessment of Competency Form are available at <u>www.immunisation.ie</u>

PHECC registered Vaccinators (EMT, Paramedics and Advanced Paramedics) **must** have attained the professional qualification, training and competence requirements as listed below in order to be eligible to administer MMR vaccines using the HSE master medicine protocols for these vaccines.
