... the SLC teams in Clare, Meath and Donegal who won the Irish Healthcare Award 2023 for Primary Care. The data collected by the teams demonstrated improved QoL, reduced GP & PHN visits, reduced cellulitis and associated hospital admissions.

Also highly commended in the Heath Service Excellence Awards 2023 was the Mater's Early Detection service for the Innovation in Service Delivery section. A snap shot of the data to date has demonstrated a reduced incidence in lymphoedema following treatment for breast and gynecological cancers.

Education



There are 3 new booklets for oncology patients at risk of lymphoedema which are available to order at healthpromotion.ie or to download at hse.ie/lymphoedema.

Also in development are new booklets for people living with lymphoedema which will be ready in the next few weeks on the Official Lymphoedema Webpage.



Lipoedema

There will be a new consensus guideline for the diagnosis and

management of lipoedema. This will be available on the website when signed off and a webinar will be arranged to introduce the guideline prior to publishing.

A patient information booklet for lipoedema will also be available.

Lymph Active App



The App for early detection of lymphoedema in oncology is in progress and will have information for patients to reduce their risk of developing lymphoedema.

The App has 3 sections; lower limb & genital, upper limb & breast, and head & neck. The pilot for the App will start in April 2024.



Dress To Compress

The HSE are currently working on a tender process for a contract for compression garments. A guideline for the procurement process for compression garments will be introduced once the contracts are in place.

Education will be rolled out before these changes are introduced.

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
