

# PERFORMANCE MONITORING REPORT - February 2008

National Service Plan 2008

31st March 2008

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## 1. KEY PERFORMANCE INFORMATION

## **Key Performance Summary**

The HSE is facing significant service pressure at the end of the first quarter beyond that anticipated at the time of preparation of the service plan. The key drivers are continued provision of services above target levels in the NHO and growth in the community based drug schemes. We have seen a growth of 12,443 (1%) in the first two months of 2008 in new medical cards issued. This is a reflection of the economic slowdown being experienced. The non implementation of the wholesale cost reductions is contributing €30m to the financial deficit at the end of Q1. NHO and PCCC are devising actions with a view to addressing the key variances arising. The management team will then take decisions following the completion of the Q1 review.

#### Key items to note for the month include:

- Launch of the Intercultural Strategy: The HSE's National Intercultural Health Strategy was launched by the Minister for Health and Children and Professor Drumm in February. The Strategy will facilitate healthcare to be provided in an inclusive, respectful and fair way to minority communities. This is against a backdrop of approximately 420,000 foreign nationals now living in Ireland. By 2030, it is expected that 18% of the population will be foreign born. This is mirrored in the number of foreign nationals working within the health services. For example, 33% of those working in the medical/dental field are from overseas, as are 14% of nurses and midwives.
- Public Nursing Home Beds: The roll out of an additional 200 long stay beds in private nursing homes to support early discharge from acute hospitals continued. At the end of February 176 beds were filled, an increase of 77 on January 156 in Dublin and 20 in the rest of the country.
- Pharmacy A Fair Price for Wholesale Services: In February advertisements were placed in the national newspapers advising patients who had concerns regarding threats from some pharmacists to cease dispensing medicines to medical card holders from March 1<sup>st</sup> 2008. Considerable effort to have robust contingency plans in place was made during February for this purpose. During February the HSE called for public submissions on community pharmacy services in Ireland with a view to developing a new contract. This new contract will clarify the professional role of the Community Pharmacy contractor under the various community drug schemes while also promoting a quality driven and cost effective service to patients and the State.
- The FactFile initiative made further advances this month with Local Health Office activity data now available for the first time.
- Following a management decision, the Chronic Disease Pilot Project will not be progressed at this time.
- The Clinical Obstetrics System went live in Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital in Dublin North Leinster.
- The first **Nurse Prescribers** went live in the National Maternity Hospital, Holles Street with a new on-line web application to support them.

## **Financial Overview**

The financial results for February show total year to date expenditure of €2.221 billion against a budget of €2.138 billion – a deficit of €3.26 million.

- While February expenditure is lower than January because of the shorter month, the deficit at the end of February is concerning.
- The deficit in the Primary Care Reimbursement Service has risen to €45m at the end of 2 months. This reflects €20m for the loss of the wholesale savings and an increase of 12,443 in the number of medical card-holders during January and February. This is a very worrying trend in cost terms.
- While PCCC business plans were prepared at the start of 2008 they would not have included these issues and management action is now required to address what is emerging.
- The deficit in hospitals is also a concern. Hospitals have been given a Maximum Expenditure Limit, however, based on the February results, significant action will be required to achieve this financial target.

The breakdown of the year to date variance between Statutory and Voluntary is as follows: Statutory €70.7m and Voluntary €11.9m

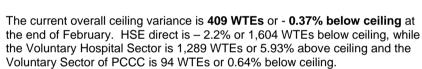
## Capital

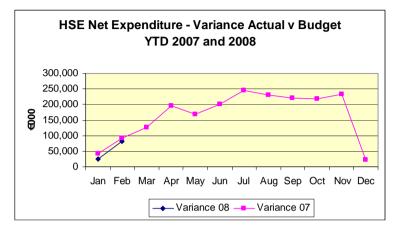
The annual budget for capital projects is €593.72 million, including €40m in respect of ICT projects. It also includes €7 million in respect of capital payments to Pobail, funded from dormant account funds. The cumulative capital cash profile for January and February 2008 was €153.94 million. The capital cash draw down for the corresponding period was €165.42 million. The capital draw down was therefore €11.48 million ahead of profile for this period.

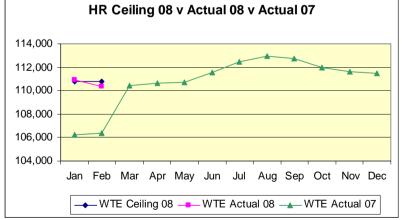
#### **HR Performance Information**

The Department of Health and Children have notified the HSE of the approved employment ceiling at the start of 2008 as being **111,505 WTEs**. Further clarification on this figure is currently being sought and is necessary prior to the sub-allocation of the new overall ceiling to Hospitals / Local Health Office / Voluntary Agency levels. Accordingly for **February report the previously approved employment ceiling of 110,789 WTEs continues to be used**, but is obviously provisional in nature. This latter ceiling reflects 2,789 new posts approved in 2007 arising from new service developments contained in the National Service Plan 2007.

February employment data shows a **reduction of 542 WTEs** on the previous month. This time last year, the corresponding data showed an increase of 86 WTEs. The Voluntary Sector in PCCC recorded a further reduction of 58 WTEs in February. The statutory sector of PCCC recorded a reduction of 58 WTEs in February.

recorded a further reduction of 58 WTEs in February. The statutory sector of PCCC recorded a reduction of 144 WTEs in the month of February.

February marked the sixth month in a row to record reductions in overall employment levels since the high of 112,983 WTEs reported at the end of August. The reduction in employment levels since the end of August was 2,603 WTEs. Whilst some of this was due to seasonal factors and student nurse placements ceasing, the majority of the reductions would have resulted from the legacy of last September's recruitment pause and tight employment control processes in place from the start of 2008.

The NHO recorded a reduction of 315 WTEs compared to January 08, with PCCC recording a reduction of 202 WTEs. There was a reduction of 25 WTE in Corporate / Others and an increase of 1 WTE was seen in Population Health. The reductions in both NHO and PCCC were distorted by the continuing reduction in student nurse placement in many hospitals and voluntary agencies, although some of the reductions in student nurse placements are offset by additional staff nurses recruited to replace them. In the case of NHO, student nurse numbers declined by 340 WTEs while in the case of PCCC the reported reduction in student nurses was 179 WTEs.

## 2. Integrated Performance Summary – PCCC

#### **PCCC Directorate Overview**

PCCC Financial expenditure for February 2008 shows a variance of €52.32m against budget of €7.96bn. This equates to a 4.1% variance against budget year-to-date.

As per our January analysis, the main driver continues to be growth in Demand Led Schemes which accounts for 86% of the variance recorded. By the end of February the deficit in the Primary Care Reimbursement Service (PCRS) had risen to €45m from €15m in January 2008. As previously reported this is explained, in part, by the ongoing delays experienced in the implementation of the new pharmacy arrangements which contributes over €20m to the variance against the planned budget in this area.

The other principal contributors to the overrun within PCRS are variance against budget within the GMS scheme and DLS such as the Drugs Payment Scheme (DPS) and the Long-Term Illness Scheme (LTI). In keeping with the trends identified last month, the number of eligible persons on medical cards continued to exhibit growth. An additional 8,111 persons became eligible for a medical card in February which equates to a 0.6% growth compared to January. The number of persons availing of LTI and DPS also increased during February. This trend is consistent with patterns of growth on the live register which saw an additional 8,500 people recorded as unemployed during February.

As previously reported, PCCC has put in place a rigorous cost containment programme for 2008 through its business planning process, comprising targets at Area and Local Health Office level. The impact of this programme will be seen on an incremental basis over the course of the year and will be monitored at all levels of the system. As at the end of February, activity is broadly in line with the targets outlined in the NSP.

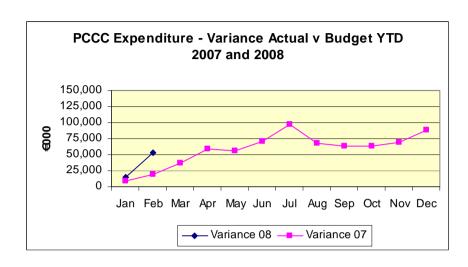

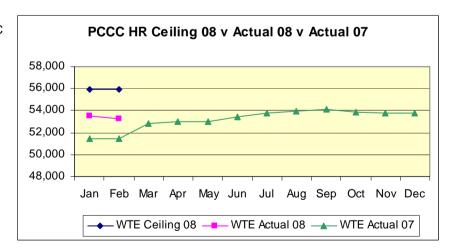
#### **PCCC HR Performance Information**

There are **53,282 WTEs** in PCCC at the end of February 2008, **2,626 WTEs or - 4.7 % below** their ceiling. All four PCCC Areas recorded a WTE reduction against January. Voluntary Sector in PCCC recorded 94 WTEs or - 0.64% below ceiling at the end of February whilst the Statutory Sector in PCCC recorded - 6.16% variance below ceiling or 2,532 WTEs.

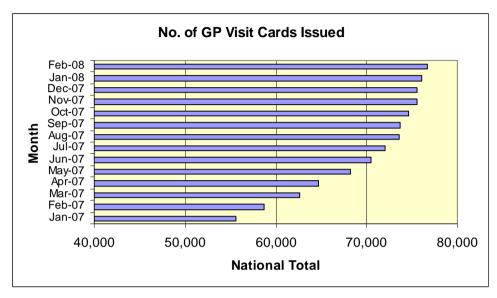
## **Analysis of Performance in PCCC**

#### **Primary Care**

*GP Visit Cards:* Sustained growth continued this month in relation to the number of eligible persons on GP Visit Cards, up 31% over the same period last year. This is due, in part, to increased public awareness about the scheme. An information booklet with full details of various schemes, including Medical Cards and GP Visit Cards, was distributed during 2007. The increase may also be attributable to the current economic climate and increase in numbers on the live register which in turn would be expected to have a negative impact on budget with an anticipated increase in the number of potential persons eligible for such schemes.

**Medical Cards:** The number of eligible persons on medical cards has increased by 8,111 since January, an increase of 0.6% in the month.

Out of Hours GP services: This is the second PMR to include monthly data on GP Out of Hours contacts. The cumulative number of contacts for January and February stands at 160,439, a rise of 11% over the same period last year. As indicated in January PMR, this is largely attributable to the consolidation of DDoc in Dublin North East, which only became fully operational late last year. As such the number of contacts for DDOC rose significantly from 4,730 in the two months - Jan/ February 2007 to 13,745 in the two months Jan/ February 2008, a variance of 190%. All other Cooperatives are largely in line with same period last year figures.



Schemes: In the January PMR we reported an overspend of approximately €15m and attributed this largely in relation to Demand Led Schemes such as LTI, DPS and High-tech claims. This has risen in February to a variance of approximately €45m which again is attributable to the growing upward trend during 2007 in the number of people eligible for schemes e.g. Medical Cards, which rose 8.111 in February; and increased drug claims particularly in the area of Demand Led schemes (approximately €10m).

As expected, the number of persons availing of LTI and DPS increased during February, while the number of additional individuals registering as unemployed in February was 8,500, the highest since August 1999. Additional number of DPS claims was almost 10,000 between January and February, a significant cost driver.

Delays experienced in the implementation of the new pharmacy arrangements are contributing to expenditure levels in the order of at least €10m per month in excess of allocated budget.

#### **Older Persons**

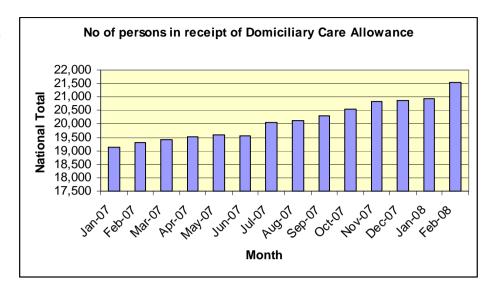
**Home Help:** As indicated in the January PMR, from January to August 2007 (January to August) HCP hours were included in Home Help hours. This resulted in an inflated target figure which was corrected in September 2007 with the removal of this element. The figures recorded now for Home Help Hours outturn in 2007 exclude Home Care Packages. As such, home help hours for the same period last year are not directly comparable. Overall, analysis of activity is broadly in line with 2008 target at national level.

Home Care Packages: Data in relation to home care packages continue to undergo validation. Figures for this period in relation to total number of home care packages are based on returns from 31 Local Health Offices as issues in DNE are currently being confirmed and data validated. The number of new clients in receipt of HCPs is based on returns from 29 LHOs. No estimates have been used for this period and as such a reduction in total figures will be evident from the January PMR.

**Nursing Home Inspections:** Last month it was anticipated that nursing home inspection variance over target would narrow as the year progressed. As expected this has reduced from a -47% variance in January to a -25% variance in February (108 inspections complete vs. target of 145), highlighting that the monthly target used is a crude measure which does not necessarily reflect the different schedule of inspections that operate within the Local Health Offices.

## **Disability Services**

Domiciliary Care Allowance continued to show growth in February. In 2007 1,934 extra clients availed of this service, representing a 10% increase for the entire year. At end February 2008, 465 extra clients claimed, compared to end 2007 figure, representing a 2% increase. An estimated cost of €350 per DCA indicates an additional €162,750 for these 465 extra clients in the first two months of the year. We will continue to monitor this service as the year progresses.



## 3. Integrated Performance Summary - NHO

#### **NHO Directorate Overview**

NHO financial expenditure (€753,761m) YTD 2008 shows a variance of €27.7m (3.8) against budget – a slight improvement on the January position. Two Hospital Groups have financial negative variances of over 6%- North East and Dublin Midlands.

Growth in in-patient (2.6%) and day case activity (11%) activity against target is contributing to this variance. The growth in day case activity ahead of target is evident in all Hospital Groups. These activity levels will be managed in line with targets to year end.

As expected the numbers presenting at Emergency Departments ytd 08 is 2.5% higher than same period last year and this is in line with the service plan target for 08. There is limited scope for hospitals to control this activity level and associated emergency admission levels.

Attendances at OPD ytd 08 significantly exceeded targets (19.1%) and attendance levels for same period in 07 (7.5%).

NHO has in place rigorous cost containment and business management programme (maximum expenditure limit) to ensure that activity levels will be managed in line with resource availability. These arrangements allow early identification of emerging trends and appropriate corrective actions will be to be taken to bring activity in line with plan. While 2008 continues to present challenges in delivering, within budget and employment ceiling, agreed service level targets, monitoring arrangement at Hospital Group and individual hospital level will ensure accountability for performance.

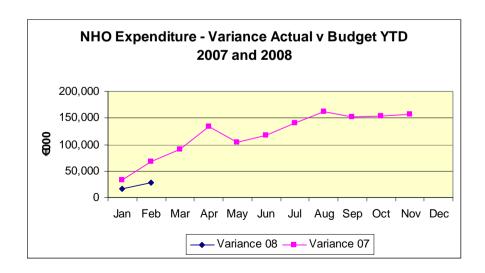

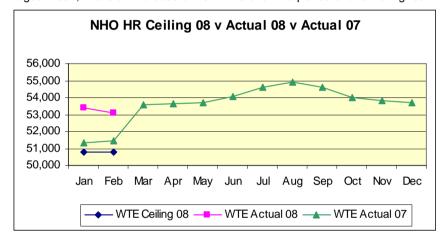

There are **53,087 WTEs** in NHO at the end of February 2008, **2,292 WTEs or 4.51% over** ceiling. On a sectoral basis, NHO statutory is 1,003 WTEs or 3.45% above ceiling, while the Voluntary Hospital Sector is 1,289 WTEs or 5.93% above ceiling.

Most hospitals reported reductions in February with the exception of the Mater Hospital, which is up 11 WTEs, Our Lady's Hospital for Sick Children up 12 WTEs, St James's Hospital up 6 WTEs, Merlin Park Hospital up 7 WTEs, Portiuncula Hospital up 10 WTEs and the South Infirmary-Victoria Hospital up 5 WTEs. In the case of Our Lady's Hospital for Sick Children there has been a reported 2.99% increase since August 2007, this is an increase of 49 WTEs over this period and is the highest in

WTEs terms. The National Maternity Hospital has the highest increase in percentage terms at 4.57% or 33 WTEs during this six month period.

The Voluntary Hospital Sector of the NHO showed a reduction of 75 WTEs while the Statutory Hospital Sector inclusive of the Ambulance Service reported a reduction of 240 WTEs during the month of February.

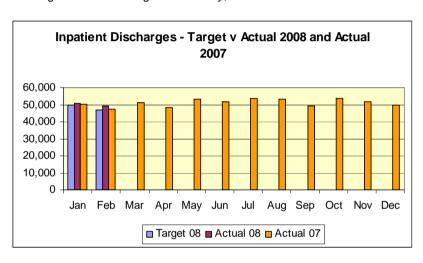

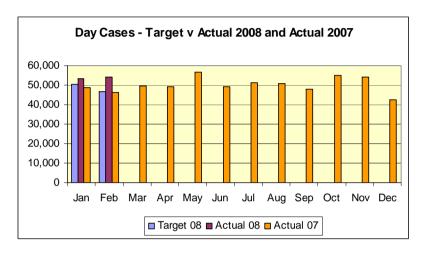
## **Analysis of Performance**

## **Inpatient and Day Case Activity**

These two graphs demonstrate the month on month trend for both inpatient discharges and day cases during 2007 and moving into February, 2008.



February activity figures show inpatient discharges are 2.6% ahead of target while day cases are 11% ahead. Over January / February 2007, 49% of all cases were treated on a daycase basis. In 2008 this proportion has risen to 52%. This is in line with the overall strategy of the NHO for 2008, as set out in the National Service Plan, that

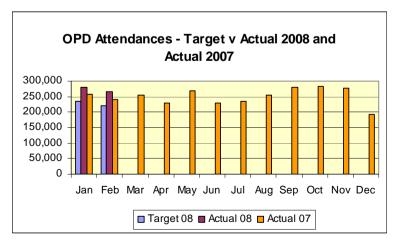


the focus will be on managing elective workloads, encouraging provision of care on a day case basis where appropriate and on performance improvements, such as day of surgery admission and minimising length of stay. The thrust of plans for 2008 is to move inpatient activity downwards, while moving day case activity upwards in relative terms as efficiency in bed use improves further and more services are provided for patients without requiring access to an inpatient bed.

## **Outpatients**

OPD targets were set in the context of existing planned levels for 2007. In other words, the 2007 target equals the 2008 planned level of activity. Given the growth over 2007, there is a significant increase of 19% already in 2008 compared to planned levels. This pattern is reflected across all networks.

However, even against this backdrop, there is an 8% increase in the number of OPD attendances compared to last year with many hospitals showing growth rates of between 10-25%.



## **Emergency Department (ED) Performance**

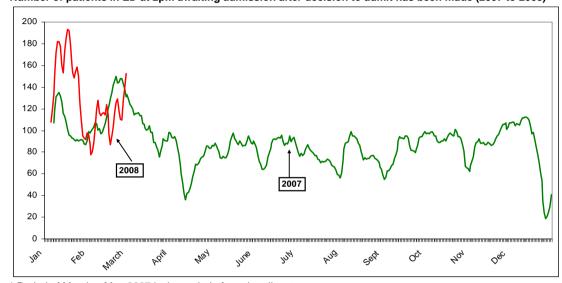
Based on a census at 2.00pm each day, the number of persons awaiting admission (following a decision to admit) rose from 7,200 in February 2007 to 7,700 in February 2008. In October 2007 we introduced a maximum 12 hour admission wait target. During January and February, there were 3,374 occurrences where patients waited more than 12 hours. This represents 44% of all patient admission waits during this year so far. The figure opposite maps the average number of persons awaiting admission during 2007 and 2008.

The number of emergency presentations to hospitals shows an increase of 2.5% compared to the same period last year. Many hospitals have dealt with significant increases in presentation levels such as Kilkenny, Waterford, Wexford, Cavan, Drogheda, Roscommon, Galway, Nenagh, Limerick, Mullingar, Portlaoise, Tullamore and St. James's.

Compared to 2007, emergency admissions were lower by almost 3%. This could be due to a variety of factors including less complex patients presenting and not requiring admission, or less in-patient bed availability. However, hospitals such as the South Tipperary, Wexford, Mater, Ennis, Mullingar, Portlaoise and Tullamore, have seen significant increases in the number of patients requiring emergency admissions. Many of these hospitals have also experienced significant increases in emergency presentations.

The stabilisation of emergency presentations during 2008 is expected as a number of viable alternatives are developed to deal with cases that could be treated in alternative settings, so reducing the dependency on use of EDs as service access points. The need to cope with demand within existing capacity presents a challenge in simultaneously improving patient experience and waiting times and this will be managed closely throughout 2008.

## Waiting lists (Hospitals reporting to NTPF)

Our target is to ensure that children wait no longer than 3 months and adults 6 months to access treatment. In February, 58% of children were waiting more than 3 months (2% improvement on January) and 33% of adults were waiting more than 6 months (1% disimprovement on January) for in-patient treatment. For day cases, 64% of children and 29% of adults were waiting over the target waiting times (2% improvement for both categories on January figures).

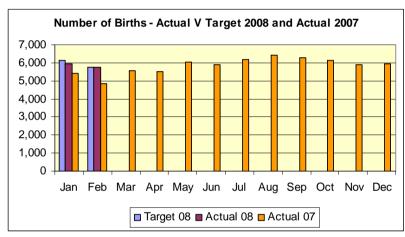
In February there were 17,059 in-patients and 24,023 day cases registered with the NTPF, giving a combined total of 41,082. These statistics represent active waiting patients only (i.e. approximately 77% of all patients waiting) and exclude those patients prescheduled (have an appointment in next 3 months but still waiting) and suspended patients.

It should be noted that according to NTPF definitions, patients are not considered to be on the waiting list until they have been waiting for more than 3 months. Up to this point, arrangements for care could be taking place for a significant number of patients. Thus, the total number of people awaiting treatment is the total number of patients waiting greater than 3 months. However, for completeness of information, all data is presented in this PMR.

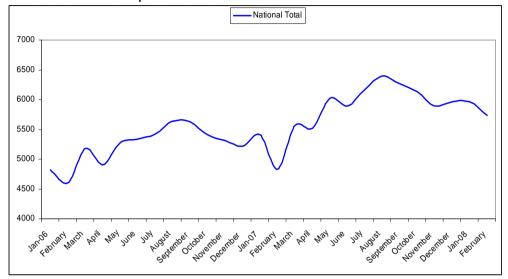
#### **Births**

There has been a substantial increase in births in the last ten years. This rate of growth, and the nature of it, has placed significant pressure on existing maternity and personal social services.

There is a 14% increase in births this year to date compared with the same period last year. Some of the increase is attributable to the inclusion of the private maternity service from the Bon Secours Hospital in Cork, following the opening of the CUMH at the end of March, 2007. In 2007, there was a significant increase in births above planned levels. During the planning process for 2008, birth numbers were assessed and activity levels for 2008 were forecast based on current trends. Compared to these planned levels, the number of births was just under 2% less than expected for the year to date. The figure on the right presents the rise in birth numbers per month since 2006 nationally.

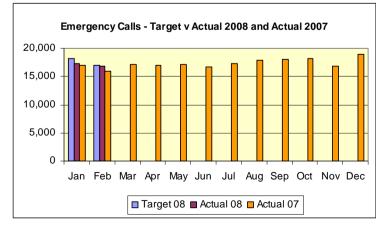


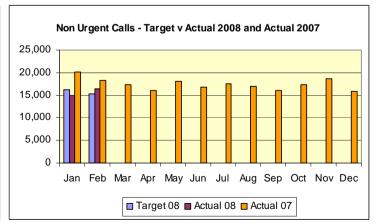
#### National number of births per month Jan 2006 to date



#### **Ambulance**

Emergency calls are 3.7% up against the same period last year but -2.8% down against the target year to date. Community Transport remains an issue that has to be resolved in 2008.





## 4. FOCUS ON A SPECIFIC POPULATION

February focus is on *Falls in Older People and Osteoporosis*. The HSE, in partnership with the Department of Health and Children and the National Council on Ageing and Older People, has prepared a Strategy to tackle these important health issues.

As our population ages, the health problems from poor bone health and falls become more common. Prevention works and it is a priority. By the year 2031 there will be one million people over the age of 65 living in Ireland (i.e. 18% of the population compared with 11% today).

One in three older people fall every year and they suffer more injuries and disability after a fall than younger age groups. Up to 300,000 Irish people over 50 years of age have osteoporosis - many are unaware of the condition until they have a fracture. Fall related injuries in older people are costly. A Burden of Illness Study on falls estimates their cost to the Irish economy at €2billion by the year 2030.

## The approach / research undertaken included:

- 1. Epidemiology and predictors of falls and osteoporosis.
- 2. Deaths and hospital utilisation due to falls and osteoporosis.
- 3. Economic burden of illness due to falls.
- 4. Prescribing costs for osteoporosis.
- 5. National audit of DXA (bone density scans) services.
- 6. Environmental aspects and safety of the 'built environment' in preventing falls.
- 7. Assessment of current services including research on patient assessment in the Emergency Department.
- 8. Development of patient pathways based on international best practice guidelines for falls and osteoporosis prevention and management.

## What is the target?

The goal of the Strategy is to:

- Implement an integrated multidisciplinary evidence based approach to:
  - Prevent deaths / injury / disability from falls in older people

#### and to

- Prevent and manage osteoporosis in the whole population.
- Set targets to measure the impact of these interventions.

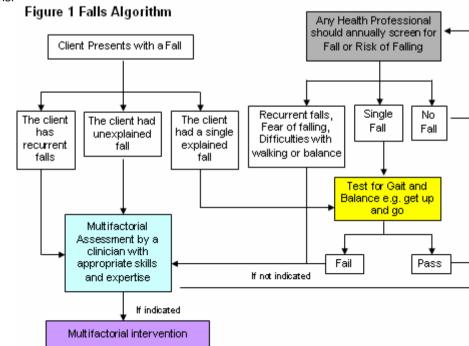
## How was the work organised?

A National Steering Group was set up develop a strategy to reduce the burden of falls in older people and osteoporosis in the whole population. Two sub-groups were established, one to focus on falls and the second to address osteoporosis. The Group produced its report and recommendations in December 2007. This was accepted by the HSE Expert Advisory Group on Older People. Its vision is to reduce deaths, disability and injury from these conditions.

#### What is the burden of falls?

Falls are predictable and preventable. Risk factors are classified as <a href="Intrinsic">Intrinsic</a> (e.g. muscle weakness, balance problems), <a href="Extrinsic">Extrinsic</a> (e.g. polypharmacy), <a href="Environmental">Environmental</a> (e.g. poor lighting). Risks can be reduced.

- Estimates show that 130,000 Irish people over 65 years of age fall every year
- Falls are responsible for 75% of all injuries in older people
- There are approximately 7,250 hospital discharges among older people after a
  fall related injury. The average length of hospital stay (alos) is 12.7 days. Of
  those, there are 2,800 discharges after hip fracture treatment where the alos is
  18 days. The acute inpatient cost alone of treating each hip fracture is €12,600.
- 250 older people die every year due to a fall. (This is higher than all other age groups combined).
- Death rates have increased in Ireland since 1990. Fall death rates increase with age over 65 and are higher in women.
- Figure 1 shows the Algorithm for managing older patients who fall. Those with unsteady gait, unexplained / recurrent falls need a multifactorial assessment and intervention.



## What is the burden of Osteoporosis?

Osteoporosis is the most common metabolic bone disease in Ireland. Early detection and effective treatment can significantly reduce its impact and improve quality of life.

Predictive risk factors are classified as <u>Modifiable</u> e.g. sedentary life-style, smoking and <u>Non-Modifiable</u> e.g. increasing age, female gender. The World Health Organisation recommends a 'selective case-finding approach' to detect people at high risk. The presence of one or more of the follow criteria (in men and women) suggests referral for BMD testing:

- Previous low trauma fracture:
- X-ray evidence of osteopenia;
- Corticosteroid use (i.e. prednisolone for three months or more);
- Family history of osteoporosis (especially maternal hip fracture);
- Other clinical risk factors: height loss, kyphosis, low Body Mass Index (<19 kg/m2);
- Possible secondary osteoporosis: primary hyperparathyroidism, poorly controlled thyrotoxicosis, malabsorption, rheumatoid arthritis, liver disease, alcoholism, primary hypogonadism.
- Women with untreated oestrogen deficiency (surgical or natural menopause <45 years, secondary amenorrhoea > 6 months not due to pregnancy or primary hypogonadism).

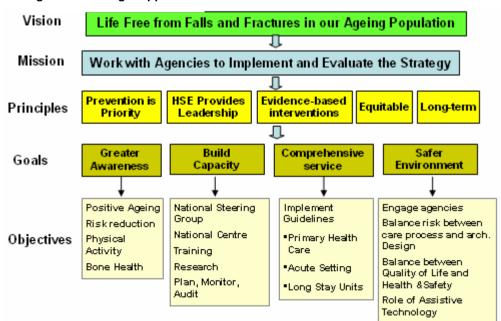
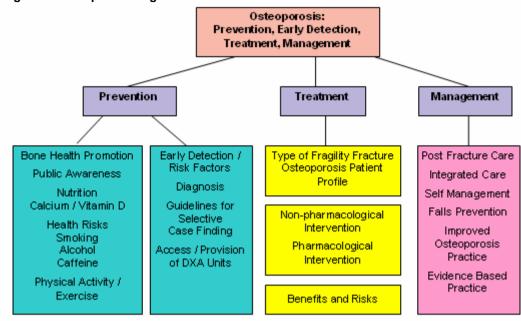


Figure 2: Osteoporosis Algorithm

Figure 2 shows the algorithm for preventing and managing osteoporosis.

Figure 3: Strategic Approach

We understand the factors that lead to poor bone health and falling in older people. We know that a structured evidence-based approach to prevention and management works. Figure 3 shows the Strategic Approach recommended by the Steering Group.

While national leadership, planning and oversight are important, this Strategy needs regional implementation by multidisciplinary teams involving:

- Health Promotion
- o Primary Health Care
- Acute Hospitals
- Long Stay Settings
- Voluntary Organisations
- Individuals, Families and Friends.

A regional implementation plan is being prepared by service directorates.
