### Current Status on Legislation and the Department Of Health National Open Disclosure Policy Framework

The Patient Safety Bill passed committee stage on 10 March 2022. A number of further amendments have been presented to government at report stage in December 2022. These amendments include (1) extending the remit of HIQA to undertake/commission reviews of incidents in private nursing homes and (2) the mandatory open disclosure of patient requested reviews in screening services. These will be discussed further in January 2023.

This legislation remains a priority for the Minster for Health. The National Open Disclosure Office will inform you of any update/ progress and will plan further training including e-learning and a webinar on this legislation in 2023.

The **National Open Disclosure Framework** is expected to be published in January 2023.
