"To ask the Minister for Health the number of children waiting greater than four months for their scoliosis surgery across Children's Health Ireland; and the steps being taken to ensure that the HSE set four month surgery target is met for all children that require scoliosis surgery during 2019 and beyond".

Dear Deputy O'Reilly,

I refer to your parliamentary question above to which I have been asked to provide a response.

Children's Health Ireland is working to reduce waiting times for children attending its orthopaedic and scoliosis services with additional investment from the HSE.

Since the allocation of additional HSE funding of €9.3m in 2018 (for both the Children's and Ireland East Hospital Groups), CHI (Children's Health Ireland), formerly CHG (Children's Hospital Group) has implemented prioritised actions from the Scoliosis 10 Point Action Plan ensuring that children, young people and their families are central to the service redesign initiatives. The co-design process of the Action Plan also included engagement with children and young people who experienced scoliosis treatment and services. This was facilitated by the Ombudsman for Children's Office.

The total number of surgeries performed in 2018 was 418 compared with 371 in 2017, an increase of 47. In 2018 there was a 13% increase in the number of spinal surgeries being performed by Children's Health Ireland compared to 2017.

See attached updated on scoliosis related surgeries as at week ending 29th March 2019.

The number of patients on the waiting list for scoliosis related surgeries as of 29th March 2019 (Ex Suspensions*) is 159, of which 83 are waiting for spinal fusion. Overall since the 1st Jan 2018, there has been a decrease of 15 or 15.3% in the waiting list for those waiting for spinal fusion surgeries (Ex suspensions).

The number of children waiting over 4 months for spinal fusion surgeries has also reduced from 35 at the start of 2019 to 31 as of 29th March 2019, which is a reduction of 4 patients or 11.4%.

The number suspensions as at 29th March 2019 is 15 (10 spinal fusions and 5 spinal other) compared to 62 (48 spinal fusion and 14 spinal other) at the start of 2018, which is a reduction of 75.8%.

There has been an additional 60 posts approved, with staff starting at different months in 2018 and 2019. CHI is currently recruiting two additional general orthopaedic consultants which will further reduce waiting times for children for an orthopaedic outpatient appointment.

All patient referrals to the orthopaedic spinal service at CHI are reviewed and clinically prioritised by a consultant. These patients are seen in order of clinical priority. Most patients are seen within 12 months.

An additional 800 OPD appointments were given to patients in CHI at Crumlin in 2018 compared to 2017 which led to a 31% reduction in the overall orthopaedic outpatient waiting list.

While we sincerely regret that any child and their family experience a long waiting time for treatment for scoliosis, the impact of investment and the implementation of the Scoliosis 10 Point Action Plan is now starting to deliver results with a consistent reduction in waiting times being recorded. We will continue to work to reduce waiting times for children and young people attending our orthopaedic and scoliosis services.

* No of patients suspended from the waiting list, as patient is temporarily unavailable or clinically unsuitable for their procedure. This includes all suspensions (hospital or patient initiated)
