Please note the initial assessment process includes the child being linked with a key worker, identifying the family's priorities, the child's presenting needs and developing a plan to address these. Roscommon Early Intervention Services aim to complete this process within a 3 month timeframe but depending on the child and family situation and the capacity of the Early Intervention Team, there may be occasions when it takes a little longer to complete this process.

The lists also include those children not able to engage in the completion of the process agreed as part of the initial assessment which can be due to the child being sick or hospitalised or the family not engaging with services. The Early Intervention Teams are linking with Tusla and Family Support Services where appropriate in such cases.

I trust that this response has clarified the matter that you have raised in this instance.
