Dear Deputy O'Reilly,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The table below details the total number of persons aged 75 years and over who have experienced an Emergency Department wait time of greater than 24hrs during the month of November 2019 (1^{st} – 30^{th} November) and for the year to date (1^{st} January to 30^{th} November 2019) per hospital.

Subject: 75+ Patients who waited over 24hrs during November 2019 and the number to date January

- November in 2019

The number of older persons presenting to Emergency Departments is growing higher than the overall increase in the general population. Older persons presenting to Emergency Departments are much more likely to be admitted and will stay twice as long as the general population. Consequently when patients wait on trolleys a higher number of patients waiting are in the older person's category and particularly in the greater than 75 years category.

The HSE is engaging in a number of programmes and initiatives to address how older people's care needs are met not just in hospital but to prevent them presenting to hospital Emergency Departments. The Integrated Care of the Older Persons Programme has invested in a number of sites across the country, which are already showing a positive impact in this regard, as is the investment in FITT teams and other initiatives to address frailty at the hospital 'front door'.

I trust this answers your question to your satisfaction.
