To ask the Minister for Health the number of cervical smear tests provided by the national screening service in each of the years 2012 to 2018

Dear Deputy

I refer to the above parliamentary question.

The information provided in the table below outlines the number of cervical smear tests taken in all clinical settings and includes routine as well as repeat smear tests.

As you are aware, CervicalCheck experienced an unprecendented demand on the programme in 2018 with many more women coming forward for screening, due to understandable concerns about cervical screening following the CervicalCheck crisis. This has resulted in a significant backlog in our laboratories causing delays in turnaround times for results.

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^{*}additional note: these are the number of smears taken **not** the number of women who have had a smear thus these figures will be greater.



We continue our efforts to seek resolution on this matter. However it will remain a significant challenge during 2019. We apologise to patients affected and we want to assure the women involved that we are doing everything possible to improve this situation.
