To ask the Minister for Health the staffing levels for CAMHS teams by CHO; and the way in which this compares with the necessary full complement of staff as outlined by A Vision for Change -Louise O'Reilly

Dear Deputy O'Reilly,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The availability of skilled staff is a significant issue in mental health services where demand outstrips supply in both the national and international contexts and our workforce (particularly younger staff) are availing of employment opportunities outside of Ireland. This is symptomatic of the overall recruitment problem that Mental Health services have been experiencing for the past number of years.

A number of posts may be covered by agency staff or overtime, or a combination of both at a particular point in time. Mental Health Services does not currently collect overall national data on locum/temporary positions filled by agency/overtime.

Table hereunder outlines the latest available data regarding current staffing levels as against the staffing levels originally outlined by Vision for Change.

There are currently 63 Development and 178 replacement posts for CAMHS at varying stages of the recruitment process with the HSE National Recruitment Service .

Similarly, there are widely acknowledged difficulties in recruiting and retaining specialist CAMHS staff, particularly Consultant Psychiatrists. Recruitment efforts continue, including local and international advertising
