The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to your above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. The following table outlines the 2018 allocation to Traveller Health:

Funding allocated annually specifically to deliver on mental health initiatives – with a focus on suicide prevention services and supports:

- 1. Exchange House is funded €350,000 to run the National Traveller Suicide Awareness Project which is a Traveller specific mental health and suicide prevention service.
- 2. €500,000 Dormant Accounts funding has been secured for 7 mental health initiatives geographically spread across the country.
- 3. 9 Traveller Mental Health Coordinators one for each CHO have been approved; 7 positions have been filled to date.
- 4. Additionally some of the funding allocated to the Traveller Health Units and Primary Health Care Projects is directed towards Mental Health workers and associated initiatives.
