To ask the Minister for Health the number of children waiting for assessment by early intervention teams in each LHO area in CHO2 at the end of April 2019 or latest date available; and the number waiting 0 to 3, 3 to 6, 6 to 9, 9 to 12, 12 to 18, 18 to 24 and more than 24 months, respectively.

Dear Deputy Murphy O'Mahony,

I refer to PQ 19863/19 uploaded on the PAD System on 2nd May 2019 addressed to the Minister for Health and due for response on 15th May 2019 regarding 'the number of children waiting for assessment by early intervention teams in each LHO area in CHO2 at the end of April 2019 or latest date available; and the number waiting 0 to 3, 3 to 6, 6 to 9, 9 to 12, 12 to 18, 18 to 24 and more than 24 months, respectively. The HSE has been requested to reply directly to you on this matter. The following response outlines the position on a county by county basis.

Co. Galway - City and County

In addition to the above, 9 further children were accepted to Mayo Early Intervention Services in April 2019. The clinicians will conduct initial visits within a 4 week timeframe to ascertain which discipline interventions are required for these additional 9 children and this will in turn determines assessment timelines. For that reason information sought up to the 30th April 2019 is not yet available.

Please note that the initial assessment includes the child being linked with a key worker, identifying the family's priorities, presenting the child's needs and developing a plan to address these. Roscommon EIS aim to complete this process within a 3 month timeframe but depending on the child and family's situation and the capacity of the EIS Team, there may

be occasions when it takes a little longer to complete this process.

Please be advised that the children on the above lists may not refer to the same children that were on the waiting lists in March 2019 as this is a live register i.e. it is constantly changing depending on where each child is in the Early Intervention Service.

The lists also include those children not able to engage in the completion of the process agreed as part of the initial assessment which can be due to the child being sick / hospitalised or the family not engaging with services. The Early Intervention Teams are linking with Tusla and Family Support Services where appropriate in such cases.

I trust that this response has clarified the matter that you have raised in this instance.
