## Statement:

In Ireland HSE continues to see measles cases reported each year. However, despite the continued measles incidence the numbers are substantially less than that reported 2010 when 403 cases were reported. The decrease in the number of cases is as a result of increased measles immunity following improvements in MMR coverage in the population. There are still gaps in immunity with some individuals not vaccinated or some too young for vaccination.

Based information provided to WHO for each year by the HSE, together with information relating to risk factors for acquiring measles and detail on links to other cases reported in Ireland, it is evident that all the cases notified since 2015 are imported cases or cases linked to imported cases. Therefore, WHO European region office has stated that Ireland has eliminated endemic transmission of measles and agrees that that the cases that are being reported are all linked to imported cases.
