The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. Your PQ above has been referred to me for response.

Please see **Appendix 1** below which shows Agency staff costs by each HSE statutory and voluntary hospital in the Acute Hospitals Division for the period January to August 2019, this being the most recent period for which information is available. The data was sourced from the HSE Consolidated Finance Intelligence (CFI) System. The 2019 data is draft and unaudited and therefore is subject to change.

Agency expenditure should be considered in the overall context including increasing demand for services; the impact of earlier constraints on recruitment in the public service; on-going challenges in relation to the recruitment and retention of clinical staff; actions necessary to support compliance with the European Working Time Directive and efforts to reduce expenditure on agency staff.

The HSE is committed to minimizing the use of Agency staff but recruitment and retention of Clinical, Nursing and other key staff is a constant challenge and impacts adversely on our ability to maintain safe and effective services. Agency staffing is also used to allow for flexible services designed to meet specific Service User needs and some short term requirements. Agency pay cost is under constant review and where possible is replaced by HSE staff.
