The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The table below details the total number of persons aged 75 years and over who have experienced an Emergency Department wait time of greater than 24hrs during the month of September 2019 (1st – 30th September) and for the year to date (1st January – 8th October 2019) per hospital.

Subject: 75+ Patients who waited over 24hrs during September 2019 and the number to date in 2019

As you will be aware older persons presenting to Emergency Departments are likely to be complex, with multiple co morbidities, have a longer Patient Experience Time (PET) in ED and to require in-patient admission. Older persons also generally require a longer length of stay which in turn places greater demand on bed capacity. The HSE through the Integrated Care of the Older Persons Programme and emerging Acute Floor concept is seeking to develop better alternatives to better manage the needs of older persons and strives to ensure no patient remains in ED for over 24 hours.

I trust this answers your question to your satisfaction.
