The information provided is based on claim data which has been received by the Primary Care Reimbursement Service (PCRS) from Community Pharmacists and includes items reimbursed by PCRS only. Data relates to claims made under the Long Term Illness scheme for the period 2016 – 2018. Figures for 2019 have not yet been collated. We cannot provide a percentage figure of the annual cost as factors such as prescription charges, DPS deductions etc., would have to be considered. We

have attached overall pharmacy costs which have been sourced from the Statistical Analysis of Claims and Payments for the relevant years.
