**Dear Deputy**

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

From 1st January 2018, with the approval of the Department of Health, the funding for both the former Home Help Service and the Home Care Package Scheme has been combined into a single service now known as the Home Support Service. With effect from the same date, home support activity reflects the total hours and clients across the Home Support Service being the totality of the amalgamated former Home Help Service and Home Care Package Scheme.

A number of support services are engaged to deliver support to persons in their homes across Kildare West Wicklow.

- Home Support Hours being provided: 524,645 hours
- No. of Clients: 1,870
- No. of persons waiting on funding for Home Support at January 2019: 333
- No. of persons waiting on funding for Home Support at 30/09/2019: 257

Whilst our home support budget is significant it is finite and we are obliged to operate within our allocated resources. Due to the overwhelming demands for Home Support that continues to rise, a waiting list remains in effect. We are dependent on hours to return to our home care package system through recycling which we commenced in February 2019.

In addition to attempting to facilitate as many discharges from the acute services particularly over the coming winter months, we will continue to work with our colleagues in the community in identifying those persons who are most vulnerable and at risk.
