
The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Please see below a list of CT scanners in public hospitals which was provided by the HSE National Clinical Head of Medical Devices. Please note that this information pertains to public hospitals only.

In terms of the medically indicated number Ireland should have, we have checked with the National Clinical Programme for Radiology and they have advised that they are not aware of any recommendation stating number of CT Scanners per head of population.
