Dear Deputy O'Reilly,

Many thanks for your representation in relation to the "Be on Call for Ireland" campaign.

From mid February 2020 the HSE began to make preparations to increase significantly the capacity within the health services in anticipation of this potential unprecedented demand for Health services.

From a staffing perspective this included a number of strategies inclusive of exploiting all existing recruitment pools, maximising agency staff, rehiring of recently retired clinicians, increasing hours of part time staff, encouraging staff to return from career breaks and the postponement of annual leave.

Initially 'Be on Call for Ireland' initiative targeted qualified health care workers who were <u>not</u> currently providing health services. Extensive on-line and telephone interviews took place to determine relevant candidates' availability to work and to determine that candidates were suitably qualified or experienced. The number of candidates of candidates who indicated they were available to work and had the relevant experience needed by the services at that time was approximately 2000.

As of 23th June 2020, 185 health and social care appointees have been deployed from the "Be on Call for Ireland" initiative to HSE services in both community, acute and public health departments. An additional 660 candidates have full recruitment clearances in place and are "job ready" as per service need. 950 candidates are in the clearance process.
