Dear Deputy Shorthall,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for response.

The Self-Isolation Facility at Citywest Hotel was set up under the governance of HSE Community Operations. This is not an acute medical facility and the purpose is to provide a safe environment for residents to self-isolate and the minimise the risk of community transmission of COVID-19. It is a self isolation facility for people who have tested positive for Covid-19 or close contacts who are at increased risk of transmission of Covid-19 and who are unable to self-isolate in their own community. The average length of stay in the Covid-19 Self Isolation Facility is 9 days.


As outlined below, the Health Service Executive (HSE) can supply information regarding the number of individuals referred from emergency accommodation and accommodated within the Citywest facility.
