Dear Deputy,
I refer to your recent parliamentary questions above which was sent to the HSE for reply.
At outset of the pandemic and to improve recruitment capacity within the HSE, the HSE explored all available channels to increase recruitment capacity inclusive of redeployment, exploring existing panels, increased the hours of part time staff and rehiring of recently retired clinicians. Recruitment within the HSE is conducted through multiple channels inclusive of local recruitment units with the Hospital Groups and Community Health Organisations but also through HBS Recruit the recruitment shared service for the HSE. The shared services conducts approx 40\% of all recruitment activity. Over the period of the pandemic 5586 appointments were made by HBS. The HSE has worked closely with CPL to increase its capacity through the Be on Call for Ireland and other initiatives. This has resulted in a further 283 appointments to the HSE Payroll for Community Swabbers together with 453 supplementary agency personnel for Contact Tracing and Be on Call.
