PQ34395/20 To ask the Minister for Health if final guidelines have been made regarding maternity hospital visits during the Covid-19 pandemic; if restrictions will be eased to allow partners to attend scans and the labour ward for the duration of the birth; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Whitmore,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Representative Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Please see attached, a copy of a document from the HSE entitled 'Visiting Practices in Maternity Services'. To the best of our knowledge, all hospitals facilitate the attendance of partners at births.

In the context of pre-natal visits there are restrictions on women being accompanied to appointments however if bad news is expected then hospitals are encouraged to use their discretion on compassionate grounds.

I trust this clarifies the matter.
