Dear Deputy Daly,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 38572 /20), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The requisite qualifications/experience for a Senior Medical Officer (SMO) post are as follows:

- (a) Be a medical practitioner who is registered other than provisionally or temporarily in the Register of Medical Practitioners for Ireland or is entitled to be so registered.
- (b) Possess a Master's in Public Health / Diploma in Public Health and /or equivalent qualification. Examples would include:
  - (i) MSc in Community Health
  - (ii) Master in Community Child Health (UK)
  - (iii) Membership of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine (Ireland or UK)
  - (iv) Membership of the Irish College of General Practitioners
  - (v) Membership of the Royal College of General Practitioners (UK)
  - (vi) Membership of the Royal College of Physicians (Ireland or UK)
  - (vii) Membership of the Faculty of Paediatrics (Ireland or UK)

(viii) Membership of the Faculty of Occupational Health (Ireland or UK)

(c) Have had, since becoming entitled to full registration, at least five years satisfactory experience in the practice of the medical profession.
