Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above 35 Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the questions and I propose to provide a singular response as the questions relate to the same issue.

I wish to advise that the HSE does not currently record data and information in the format that you have sought in some of your questions.

The Open Beds Report provides an outline of the average numbers of open and available inpatient beds and day beds/places in the acute hospital system on a monthly basis. The Open Beds Report is published on the Department of Health Website and can be accessed using the link below.

1. Context

The HSE Acute Business Information Unit collects and reports on the average number of funded acute inpatient beds and funded acute day-case beds/places open and available for use, by Specialty, during each monthly reporting period. Separately, the HSE collects data on the bed complement; however, this data does not take account of factors such as temporary bed closures. Accordingly, for the purpose of answering the Deputy's questions it is considered that the Open Beds Report is the more relevant source.

The Open Beds Report, includes all activity associated with acute inpatient and day-case beds as follows:

- Acute surgical and Medical beds
- Critical Care beds (ICU/HDU/Coronary Care Unit)
- Maternity beds
- Paediatric beds
- Acute Psychiatry beds
- AMAU overnight beds

The report records bed days available and bed days used by Specialty. Accordingly, it is not possible to separate out critical care beds or overnight AMAU beds within the beds available figure due to the nature of how the data is returned. The bed complement data provides this information and this information is set out in Table 1 below.

Exclusions from the Open Beds Report are AMAU treatment places, Sub Acute beds and Community Psychiatry beds. While in some cases these beds are located on an acute campus these beds are not available to patients for acute care. These are recorded separately as they are not Acute in-patient beds. AMAU same day treatment spaces are operational for part of the day to assess patients. The number of beds/spaces comprehended by these categories are set out below:

- The number of AMAU same day treatment spaces as of December 2019 was 281.
- The number of sub-acute and Community Psychiatric beds as of December 2019 were 636.

All data related to beds at this time is collected monthly on an aggregated basis and as such it is not possible to report the data for a specific day. However, the Open Beds Report shows the average daily number of funded beds open and available during any given month.

The number of funded available beds can fluctuate month to month dependent on factors such as bed closures or increased funded capacity. There are usually a higher number of closures in December each year as there is generally less elective care delivered over the Christmas period.

2. Funded Capacity 2016-2019

Methodologies in collecting data have been revised and improved over a number of years. Comparing year on year data will include changes to data collection over this time.

Table 1 below sets out the average in-patient beds available for the years 2016 to 2019 at the end of each year. This demonstrates an increase of 488 average inpatient beds available from 2016 to 2019.

3. 2020/2021 Acute In-patient Beds

2020

At the beginning of 2020, there were 10,733 in-patient beds available (excluding critical care). The expected number of funded In-patient beds to be added to the baseline in 2020 is 704. This includes the following:

- 40 beds at South Tipperary General Hospital that were funded as part of 2019 Estimates but opened during 2020.
- 664 beds opened during 2020 as follows;
 - 426 temporarily funded beds brought on-stream this year as part of the Winter Plan 2019/2020 using NTPF funding and funding for the COVID response.
 The funding announced in the budget will allow these beds to be maintained permanently.
 - o 238 additional beds funded under the Winter Plan.

This will bring the number of in-patient beds open at the end of 2020 to 11,437. It should be noted that the activity associated with a number of the beds funded by NTPF may be more appropriately coded as sub-acute activity. An exercise is underway with HPO to determine the appropriate coding of such activity when the beds are funded permanently.

Note: The Acute Hospital system has experienced a significant increase in the number of bed closures due to COVID-19 this year. These closures relate to management of infection outbreaks, necessary refurbishment to meet COVID requirements and increased staff absence due to COVID. In September 2019 the weekly average of Inpatient beds closed was approximately 98. This figure has increased to a weekly average of 340 Inpatient beds in September 2020.

2021

It is planned that a further 260 beds will open between January 2021 – March 2021 approved as part of the Winter Plan 2020/2021.

A further 222 beds are expected to open between April – December 2021 which are funded as part of the Estimates 2021.

In summary, the 1,146 additional beds approved under the Winter Plan 2020/21 and Estimates 2021 are funded until end 2021.

The expected number of Acute Inpatient beds available for deployment by end of 2021 is 11,919. It is anticipated that the total number of beds available will fluctuate from time to time due to social distancing and infection control measures that may be required at individual sites.

4. Critical Care

The 2021 budget provides for the increase of adult critical care beds from 255 to 321 by the end of 2021. This represents a total increase of 66 adult beds.

a. 40 adult beds are funded temporarily in COVID; these are now funded through the Estimates on a full year basis.

b. 26 additional adult beds are funded in the Estimates

This will result in a total increase of 66 ICU new beds

Current status

As of October, 2020 there are 31 of the 40 beds open bringing the number of critical care beds to 286.

By the end 2020, we will have opened 37 beds open bringing the total 292.

By the end 2021, we plan to open the remaining 29 beds bringing the total to 321.
