Question: “To ask the Minister for Health the number of Covid-19 tests which have been carried out on teachers since the reopening of schools until 18 September 2020; and the number that resulted in a positive diagnosis”.

Dear Deputy Costello,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

I wish to apologise for the delay in issuing a response to your above question.

Due to the current demands of the Covid-19 pandemic and the numerous queries we have received to date it has taken longer than I would've liked to respond.

I'm sure you will understand we cannot comment on individual cases or educational facilities but I wish to confirm that a total of 384 facilities have undergone mass testing to date in educational facilities following Public Health risk assessments. There have been 125 detected cases, which is a positivity rate of 1.7%, identified across 47 schools confirming 20 individuals are over 18 and the remaining 105 are under 18. Please see below the number of educational facilities broken down by Public Health Department:

We have undertaken testing in childcare, primary, post primary and special education facilities where a total of 9,345 staff and students have been tested. Of all those tested, 14% (1,296) are aged over 18 and the remaining 86% (8,049) are under 18. The results of these tests are presented in the below table;
