PQ18659/21 To ask the Minister for Health the number of persons that have signed up to the Be on Call for Ireland database in each county; and the number that signed up that have been recruited to work in the health service in each county.

Dear Deputy Tóibín

Many thanks for your query in relation to the 'Be on Call for Ireland' recruitment initiative.

The majority of COVID-19 related recruitment is undertaken by the HSE National Recruitment Service and local recruitment offices in Acute and Community Services. To date approximately 9539 additional staff have recruited through NRS in response to COVID-19 management and the provision of continuing health and social care services to the population of Ireland. 'Be on Call for Ireland' was an additional recruitment stream to on-going HSE recruitment to harness any additional relevant healthcare sourcing outside national and local recruitment.

The number of applications for the 'Be on Ireland on Call' initiative was approximately 74,000+, however over 44,000 of the applications were either administrative/support/volunteers. Fortunately the management and administration requirements were met through redeployment both across the health services but also across the broader civil and public service. It was important that the HSE targeted its efforts to provide health services and therefore many of the essential support (non- health care) services were provided through Volunteer Ireland and other well established networks such as the GAA. The 15,000+ volunteer applicants were redirected towards Volunteer Ireland.

When examining the remaining applicant pool of 30,000 it was essential that the HSE took a broad view of the health services and did not in any way destabilise existing services by depleting other parts of the services i.e. private hospitals, voluntary organisation or private nursing homes.

Of this number it was immediately established over 10,000 were already working in the health services. 1,000 were not registered with the relevant body and therefore could not work. A further 3,000 were undergraduates and over 1,000 withdrew. This left a residual number of approximately 15,000. It was this approximately 15,000 that became the focus of the initiative to provide the additional resources to the HSE as needed. Further on line screening was undertaken to ascertain who were available to work as required by HSE services and passed the screening interview, this left an active candidate pool of approximately 2,000 candidates. Candidates who remained interested in working in the HSE during the pandemic progressed through the recruitment clearances and were offered roles as they arose. Cpl aimed to match candidate availability with HSE service requirements.
