Re: PQ19393 To ask the Minister for Health the number of P1 variant of Covid-19; the attributed source for these cases; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Cairns,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

Up to the end of week 14, 2021, 8000 cases of confirmed COVID-19 notified to the Health Protection Surveillance Centre's (HPSC) Computerised Infectious Disease Reporting System (CIDR) have an available whole genome sequencing (WGS). The P.1 (Brazil) VOC has been confirmed in 24 confirmed cases of COVID-19. These cases have an epidemiological date (see notes) between week 4 and week 13, 2021. The most likely source of transmission is recorded as 'travel related' for 14 cases, and 'close contact with a confirmed case' for 10 cases.

Notes

- WGS sequencing data were provided by National Virus Reference Laboratory (NVRL). Epidemiological data
 on these cases were extracted from the Health Protection Surveillance Centre's (HPSC) Computerised
 Infectious Disease Reporting System (CIDR) on 20/04/2021.
- CIDR is a dynamic system and case details may be updated at any time. Therefore, the data described here may differ from previously reported data and data reported for the same time period in the future.
- WGS is carried out by the NVRL and partners. Current whole genome sequencing capacity is approximately 1,000 specimens per week.
- Of note, there is a time lag between specimen date and WGS results becoming available.
- The epidemiological date is the earliest of onset date, date of diagnosis, laboratory specimen collection date, laboratory received date, laboratory reported date, event creation/notification date
- All medical practitioners, including clinical directors of diagnostic laboratories, are required to notify the Medical Officer of Health (MOH)/Director of Public Health (DPH) of any confirmed, probable or possible cases of COVID-19 that they identify. Laboratory, clinical and epidemiological data, on notified COVID-19 cases, are recorded on CIDR.
