Dear Deputy Kerrane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 60451/21) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The number of applications made for the reimbursement of costs for blood tests with a general practitioner in 2019, 2020 and received to date in 2021.

Applications for refunds of costs of blood tests are made at CHO level. The HSE will investigate instances where clients are charged for blood tests by their General Practitioner. Any investigation is dependent on the client providing consent to permit the HSE to contact their General Practitioner. However in many instances clients do not provide the HSE with the consent to contact their General Practitioner and the client subsequently withdraws their applicant for a refund.

Any refunds approved are paid to the applicants by the Primary Care Reimbursement Service (PCRS). The PCRS have advised that information regarding the number of applications approved and paid out for 2019 & 2020 is not available.

Please note that the current average waiting time for reimbursement is not available.
