“To ask the Minister for Health the total amount invested by Cork and Kerry HSE management in a community residence (details supplied) for persons with mental health difficulties; the breakdown of the figures for purchase, renovations, legal fees and other costs that may be associated with the residence; the projected total annual running costs of the facility; the date of purchase of the property by the HSE; the projected timeframe for the commencement of services, accounting for the possibility of planning objections; and if he will make a statement on the matter.”

Dear Deputy Hourigan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I can confirm that the property, Glenwood House, Carrigaline, Co. Cork has been purchased for €750,000 by Cork Kerry Community Healthcare, Health Service Executive. The contract for the purchase of the property was closed on 6th January 2021.

The HSE intends to undertake limited minor works at the premises. It is intended that the building will provide a residential service for those aged 18 years and older. Consultations with the local community are currently ongoing.

Renovation works at Glenwood House are ongoing and therefore total costs associated with the purchase and renovation are not available at this time. Similarly, the budget for the running of the facility has not yet been finalised however I can assure you that sufficient resources will be made available to ensure that any residents availing of services in the new facility will receive a high quality service which best meets their assessed level of care requirements.
