Re: PQ 10609/21 “To ask the Minister for Health if staff at meat factories are the subject of regular Covid-19 tests; and if he will make a statement on the matter”.

Dear Deputy Ryan,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.


The Serial Testing programme at meat and food processing plants commenced on 21st August 2020 following the recommendation by the National Public Health Emergency Team (NPHE). This Serial Testing is operating nationally within an agreed schedule which is once every four-weeks and is informed with guidance from the HSE Public Health. We are testing approximately 85 meat and food processing facilities nationwide.

Serial Testing is now established as a core component of the overall testing and contact tracing service. To date we have completed 125,394 tests in the Meat and Food Processing Plants Serial Testing programme with an overall positivity rate of 0.85%.

Where an outbreak occurs in a meat or food processing facility then outbreak mass testing will still occur. Public Health will be in touch locally in those situations. If a plant has confirmed cases, there is a Public Health Assessment which determines what interventions are required and the subsequent frequency of testing. In all cases where an individual receives a detected result, the contact tracing process begins.

I trust this information is of assistance to you.
