PQ5371/21: To ask the Minister for Health if scheduled cervical screening appointments for persons based in an area (details supplied) have been fully reinstated under current level 5 Covid-19 restrictions; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Details supplied: the Dublin Central constituency

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question.

CervicalCheck is aware that some GP practices and community clinics may not be able to offer cervical screening appointments, or may be operating at reduced capacity, in the short term due to the pressures of the third wave of COVID-19.

CervicalCheck continues to support GP practices and community clinics making individual decisions about the level of screening that is safe for them to provide, as they adhere to Government guidelines and Public Health advice about the spread of COVID-19.

We continue to ask women to keep in touch with their GP and to take the earliest appointment offered to them, even if it is four to six weeks away. We are also letting women know that they do not need to book for screening with their own GP, and can book with any sampletaker in their area. A list of registered sampletakers is available on our website [here](#).

We do not have a mechanism for capturing temporary closures and re-openings of individual clinics, such as in the case of a provider having to restrict services due to a positive COVID-19 case or close contact.

However, our preliminary data shows that the majority of registered cervical screening providers were operational and took samples nationally in January 2021.

We continue to ask that people do not attend their appointment if they are unwell or self-isolating because they have symptoms of COVID-19. People should not attend either if they are a confirmed close contact of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus.

Cervical screening is for well people who do not have symptoms. Anyone who is worried about symptoms at any time is advised not to wait for screening but to contact their GP immediately, for appropriate follow-up care.
