PQ5372/21: To ask the Minister for Health the reason persons (details supplied) based in County Dublin cannot access screening services via their general practitioner practice; when these services will resume; if alternative screening services are available to persons in the interim: and if he will make a statement on the matter

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question.

CervicalCheck is aware that some GP practices and community clinics may not be able to offer cervical screening appointments, or may be operating at reduced capacity, in the short term due to the pressures of the third wave of COVID-19.

CervicalCheck continues to support GP practices and community clinics making individual decisions about the level of screening that is safe for them to provide, as they adhere to Government guidelines and Public Health advice about the spread of COVID-19.

CervicalCheck has spoken to Navan Road Medical & Dental Primary Care Centre and they have confirmed that they resumed offering appointments for cervical screening at the beginning of February, after a short pause in January due to third wave of COVID-19.

We continue to ask women to keep in touch with their GP and to take the earliest appointment offered to them, even if it is four to six weeks away. We are also letting women know that they do not need to book for screening with their own GP, and can book with any sampletaker in their area. A list of registered sampletakers is available on our website here.

We continue to ask that people do not attend their appointment if they are unwell or self-isolating because they have symptoms of COVID-19. People should not attend either if they are a confirmed close contact of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus.

Cervical screening is for well people who do not have symptoms. Anyone who is worried about symptoms at any time is advised not to wait for screening but to contact their GP immediately, for appropriate follow-up care.
