**Re:** PQ - 5517/21 - To ask the Minister for Health if he will seek and share a detailed report on the causal factors that led to the disposal of 22 vials of a vaccine in the Louth Meath midlands community health area; and if he will make a statement on the matter – Fergus O'Dowd

Dear Deputy O'Dowd,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and outline the position as follows.

22 vials of Covid-19 vaccine that were delivered to a nursing home in Midlands Louth Meath Community Healthcare Organisation were incorrectly stored and the appropriate cold chain was not in place. Unfortunately they could not be used and this incident was very disappointing for all concerned, residents and staff.

The breach was reported and all necessary processes were followed. A review was undertaken in line with the HSE Incident Management Framework.

The review identified the following key learning points which have been shared with public and private residential care facilities in the CHO and with Covid Vaccination leads in each CHO:

1. When vaccines are delivered and accepted into a centre, the vaccine must only be handed over to and accepted by a member of the nursing team.

2. The nurse accepting delivery of the vaccines into their facility must maintain the cold chain by ensuring that the vaccines are immediately stored in a medical grade fridge

at the appropriate temperature in line with HSE Guidelines for maintenance of cold-chain in vaccine fridges and management of vaccine stock

3. The Nurse in Charge must at the earliest opportunity or at the next handover inform the nursing team the vaccines have arrived and are in safe storage and this must be relayed to the next shift of nurses coming on duty.

4. The centre needs to risk assess the medical grade fridge in advance of the vaccine delivery to ensure it has sufficient capacity to store the vaccines safely.

We are sorry that this incident took place and all eligible residents and staff have now been vaccinated
