\* \* To ask the Minister for Health if there is an imminent plan to cut a community lactation consultant position in south-east Dublin; the rationale for the proposed cut; if he will reconsider the decision given the increasing demand for lactations service in Ireland; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Nash,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health and Children for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

Community Healthcare East is committed to supporting and promoting breastfeeding and has a long track record in supporting mothers. However, Covid-19 has presented unprecedented challenges for many of our services.

Demand for services associated with this current third wave of Covid-19 has been exceptionally high due to the level of community transmission of infection.

Levels of staff absenteeism necessitated the urgent redeployment of a part-time Public Health Nursing staff member to cover service gaps in order to mitigate significant clinical risk to service users. The Public Health Nursing team had identified and designated another Lactation Consultant to immediately assist with referrals of those mothers who may require support, and with the weekly online breast-feeding support group that commenced last October. This Consultant replaced the redeployed staff member on Monday 25th January. There was no gap in service provision. Lactation consultant support remains available to all mothers who require it in Dublin South East.

Every new mother continues to be visited by a Public Health Nurse within 72 hours of hospital discharge, and home visits supporting breast-feeding mothers have continued throughout the Covid-19 pandemic.
