PQ~10990/21 — To ask the Minister for Health the number of extra posts, taking into account temporary vacancies and maternity leave, that would be needed in Ballymun, Dublin 11 to eliminate the waiting lists for speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, physiotherapy and psychology; and if he will make a statement on the matter. — Paul~McAuliffe

Dear Deputy McAuliffe,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

It would not be possible to predict the exact number of extra posts needed to eliminate waiting lists across all the services in Ballymun. Unfortunately, having extra staff in post is not the only factor which would eliminate waiting lists. There are other factors such as budget constraints, availability of suitable accommodation and having a qualified pool of staff to train and recruit from. Another factor is unforeseen problems such as the impact of a global pandemic across all service levels and ultimately waiting lists.

As part of national healthcare reforms being implemented under the Sláintecare cross-party agreement, the Enhanced Community Care Reform Programme is currently underway across Community Healthcare Organisation - Dublin North City and County. The investment in an Enhanced Community Care Model will be delivered on a phased basis with a view to national coverage being achieved within a 2-3-year period. As part of the programme the Ballymun Area Network was chosen as the Learning Site for the introduction of the Community Healthcare Network model of care. The principles underpinning this model of working is to support greater integration across services, ensuring timely access to quality services and to provide person centered care locally to those living within their community. An additional 191 posts have been approved for Community Healthcare Network for CHO DNCC for 2021.

As part of the Community Healthcare Network model, five additional clinical posts have been approved for the Ballymun Area Network and are currently being recruited. This should have a positive impact on waiting lists.

CHO DNCC is committed to improving access to services and this has been identified as a priority by the HSE Board. This can only be done by strengthening public capacity, utilising private capacity where appropriate and adopting new ways of working via digital platforms, etc.
