The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the following parliamentary questions, which were submitted to this department for response.

### PQ 12192/21

To ask the Minister for Health further to Parliamentary Question No. 550 of 20 January 2021, if he will provide a full and accurate breakdown of the assessment of needs requests by primary concern listed on the application forms between 2016 to the latest date in 2021; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

# PQ 12193/21

To ask the Minister for Health further to Parliamentary Question No. 550 of 20 January 2021, if he will provide a full and accurate breakdown of the assessment of needs requests by suggested supports listed on the application forms between 2016 and to date in 2021; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

### **HSE Response**

Since the Disability Act commenced in June 2007, the HSE has endeavoured to meet its legislative obligations under the Act. However, as a consequence of a High Court ruling of December 2009, the effect of which was to open eligibility to all children born after 1st June 2002, the number of children aged five and over, and in addition of school-going age, has risen steadily as a percentage of all applications received. At the end of 2011, the figure stood at 26%, while throughout 2020, this figure averaged 54%. This is a reflection that the AON process is an accumulative process in terms of numbers of children seeking access. However, it is acknowledged that the numbers of assessments overdue for completion remain high, although there had been some improvement in these figures in 2018 and 2019 prior to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Assessment of Need is reported on a quarterly basis and the information contained in this quarterly report is based on data extracted from the Assessment Officers' System Database (AOS). With regard to your queries concerning assessment of needs requests by primary concern and assessment of needs requests by suggested supports listed on the application forms, this information is not collated



as the AON application form provides applicants with a free text box to outline the concerns, rather than a drop-down menu of choices. This type of data is extremely useful for informing the appropriate pathway for each child but cannot be collated in the manner suggested.

However, for information, please see the Appendix 1 below, which contains table 4b from each quarterly report for 2020. This table shows the frequency (ranked nationally) with which a requirement for certain services has been indicated in Assessment Reports completed during the quarter, including reviewed reports. The pattern in consistent year on year.

I also attach the Q4 report for 2020 as an example of the data that is collected.
