Thank you for your questions. In line with the roll out of a vaccination programme the National Immunisation Office has developed clear guidance on what to expect following the administration of a COVID vaccine. Available in the link below:

The information outlines the commons side effects of the three vaccines that are being used at present and when a person should seek medical assistance. As each person receives the COVID vaccine a vaccine checklist is completed and the relevant information about the vaccine and side effects is shared with them as part of the consent process.
