“To ask the Minister for Health the locations of community assessment hubs; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Colm Burke”

Dear Deputy Burke,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 14853/21), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

There are currently four operational community assessment hubs (CAHs) which are located in Donegal (Letterkenny), Dublin (Tallaght), Dublin (Mater Hospital) and Dublin (DCU Glasnevin). The current number and locations of CAHs is sufficient to meet demand which has significantly reduced in recent weeks. The number of referrals to CAHs in the week ending 4<sup>th</sup> April has reduced by approximately 90% compared to the number of weekly referrals to CAHs in early to mid-January 2021.

CAH capacity can be scaled up to meet future demand if required as follows;

- Increase capacity of CAHs operating on a part time basis to full time
- Monitoring of Covid data as objective markers to aid decision making regarding reopening CAHs
- Facility to open / re-open CAHs to become operational within 1 week

In January 2021 the number of CAHs was increased from 8 to 15 based on the criteria set out above . This near doubling of capacity also resulted in a greater geographical availability of services with at least one operational CAH in each CHO area.
