Dear Deputy Browne,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 15100/21), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE is working to ensure timely access to children and adults requiring speech and language therapy services, and to reduce long waiting times for this important service. The HSE is committed to delivering efficient high quality speech and language therapy services to all eligible service users. In full year 2020 a total of 165,657 children and adults were seen by HSE community speech and language therapy clinics.

To address the current third wave of Covid infections there was a requirement to prioritise the level of services delivered during this period. Building upon the experience from earlier waves of the pandemic, Community Services have developed a prioritisation framework to support local decisions to be made on service prioritisation. This approach will ensure that services will be focused on identifying and supporting patients who have the greatest need and enabling staff to be deployed where necessary to support these patients. Where services are curtailed or reduced, this will be in line with clinical approval, a shared national position and with an appropriate risk assessment and communication with providers, service users and families. It is the intention of Community Services that full services, including speech and language therapy services and occupational therapy services, would return as soon as is safe and practicable.
