To ask the Minister for Health the status of efforts to approve dupilumab commonly known as dupixent used to treat eczema and asthma among other conditions; and if he will make a statement on the matter. -Alan Farrell.

Dear Deputy Farrell,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 15426/21), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Dupilumab is available for reimbursement under the High Tech arrangements from the 1st of April 2021 for moderate-to-severe atopic dermatitis in refractory adults and adolescents 12 years and older for whom immunosuppressant treatment has failed, or is not tolerated or is contraindicated.

A Managed Access Protocol is in place for Dupilumab. The protocol outlines the criteria that must be satisfied in order for a patient to be recommended for reimbursement of Dupilumab under High Tech Arrangements.
