To ask the Minister for Health the breakdown of the recurring funding for each hospice (details supplied) announced on 17 January 2021; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Lahart,

The Minister has requested the HSE to respond directly to you on this matter and I wish to sincerely apologise for the delay in doing so.

A total of €10.68 million in recurring funding has been made available to six voluntary specialist palliative care providers in 2020 and 2021. This allocation will significantly improve core funding, reduce the over-reliance on fundraised income, ensure the sustainability of specialist palliative care services, including the capacity to meet the increasing needs of individuals and families for ongoing support and end-of-life care. The individual allocations are included in the table below.
