“To ask the Minister for Health the details of the family resource centres in County Cork which receive funding from agencies under his remit; and if he will make a statement on the matter.”

Dear Deputy Cairns,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Family Resource Centres (FRC's) are supported by TUSLA- Child and Family Agency and by the National FRC programme and the HSE are not the primary funders. However, Cork Kerry Community Healthcare provided the funding to the FRC's listed below in 2020. This funding included core funding and may also include additional funding that was applied for and allocated from lottery funding or once-off additional payments approved during the year. On receipt of requests for additional once-off funding, they are reviewed by CKCH and approved as appropriate.
