Dear Deputy Browne TD,

Thank you for your query. I apologise for the delay the cyberattack has caused in providing you with a response.

As of Monday 19th July, 5,230,100 have doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered nationally, across all cohorts specified in the Government's vaccine rollout plan found here:

https://www.gov.ie/en/publication/39038-provisional-vaccine-allocation-groups/.

As Ireland does not have a central disease repository, it is not possible to specify the number of 'immunocompromised patients' who have received a dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. A breakdown by doses administered by vaccine cohorts is available here:

https://covid19ireland-geohive.hub.arcgis.com/pages/vaccinations.

I'm glad to advise that registration for a COVID-19 vaccine is now open for people aged:

- 18 to 24 who want to opt in to get the AstraZeneca vaccine if a Moderna or Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine is not available
- 25 to 69

Everyone who registers online will automatically be offered either the Moderna or Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine when it is available.

But people aged 18 to 34 will also have a choice to opt in or out of getting the AstraZeneca vaccine if it is available earlier than the Moderna or Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine.

I hope this provides you with assistance.
