Dear Deputy Ward,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

In certain circumstances, a person may be admitted to hospital against their will. This is an 'involuntary admission.' Under the Mental Health Act 2001, a person may be involuntarily admitted and detained in an approved centre if they are suffering from a mental illness.
