Re PQ 55521 21: To ask the Minister for Health the amount spent by the HSE in contracting debt collection agencies to pursue unpaid statutory charges in each of the years 2013 to 2020 and to date in 2021, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

PQ 55522 21: To ask the Minister for Health the costs incurred by each public hospital in contracting external debt collection agencies to pursue unpaid statutory charges in each of the years 2013 to 2020 and to date in 2021, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

PQ 55523 21: To ask the Minister for Health the number of inpatients or inpatient day cases with unpaid inpatient charges whose debt was referred to a debt collection or legal agency in each of the years 2013 to 2020 and to date in 2021, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter

PQ 55524 21: To ask the Minister for Health the expenditure by the HSE and public hospitals on referral of statutory charges to external debt collection or legal agencies; the breakdown of expenditure per charge, that is, inpatient charge, outpatient and emergency charge in each of the years 2013 to 2020 and to date in 2021, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Higgins,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. Your PQ's above have been referred to me for response.

In response to your **PQ 55521 21**, please see **Appendix 1 Table 1** below which shows the total amount spent by the HSE on debt collection agencies for all HSE Statutory locations for the years 2013 to 2020 which is the most recent data available.

In response to your **PQ 55522 21**, please see **Appendix 2 Table 1** below which shows the total amount spent by the HSE on debt collection agencies by each HSE Statutory Acute hospital only for the years 2013 to 2020 which is the most recent data available.

All data was sourced from HSE Regional Finance ledgers. Please note in view of the fact that there are still currently numerous ledger systems in operation in the HSE some differences in coding may arise. The data is for HSE statutory services only. If you are seeking data relating to voluntary entities, you should submit FOI requests to these directly as publicly funded voluntary hospitals are separate entities for FOI purposes. In relation to your **PQ 55523 21** requesting "the number of inpatients or inpatient day cases with unpaid inpatient charges whose debt was referred to a debt collection or legal agency in each of the years 2013 to 2020 and to date in 2021" and the second part of your **PQ 55524 21** for 'the breakdown of expenditure per charge, that is, inpatient charge, outpatient and emergency charge in each of the

years', I must inform you that as debt collection continues to be managed at a local level this type of data is not captured centrally within the HSE and is therefore not available.

The shortcomings in the HSE legacy financial systems are well acknowledged and their replacement by a single standard financial system for the Health Sector is at the core of the Finance Reform programme initiated by the Department of Health.

Patients who attend at public hospitals are, depending on their eligibility, and subject to certain exemptions, liable to statutory charges. These are levied under the provisions of the 1970 Health Act. The charges are €100 for an Emergency Department attendance and €80 for an overnight stay, the latter charge is capped at €800 in any 12 month period. The HSE has a statutory obligation to levy and collect these charges and Hospitals have the discretion to operate payment plans where appropriate.

The COVID-19 pandemic had a profound effect on activity in public hospitals in 2020. At times during the year non-urgent elective surgery was cancelled on NPHET advice; and some activity was displaced into private hospitals. It is also important to note that patients suffering from COVID-19 were exempt from statutory charges.

Hospitals are required, under NFR 25, to refer an unpaid debt to a collection agency after a period of time from date of billing. If any patient has difficulty paying a hospital bill the regulations allow for the hospital and the patient to agree an installment arrangement.

The HSE seeks to maximise the recovery of income in a socially responsible, ethical, efficient and cost effective way. It should be noted that the collection of monies owed is a continuous, daily and large scale process.
