Note 1: In relation to the €7.65m additional Mental Health beds, Mental Health services were obliged to undertake a detailed procurement process with various private providers to enable commencement of services. While there is minimal spend in 2021 it is expected that the full budget will be utilised in 2022.

Note 2: The €5m once off COVID placements fund relates to short term placements required in Mental Health acute units required to generate spacial requirements due to COVID.
