**PQ 56228/21 - To ask the Minister for Health the number of adults and children on podiatry waiting lists by CHO for each quarter since quarter 4 2018, in tabular form; the number of those waiting more than 12, 24 and 52 weeks respectively; and if he will make a statement on the matter.**

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Dear Deputy Cullinane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 56228/21) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

COVID-19 has posed significant challenges for many service areas. In light of these unprecedented challenges together with the Government's guidance on social distancing and on 'Cocooning' for those aged over 70, the HSE has had to reassess its operation of Community Services nationally, to ensure that the assessed needs of those clients with the highest priority are met.

The HSE is committed to delivering efficient high quality Podiatry services to all eligible service users. In 2020, there were 47,985 patients seen by HSE Community Podiatry services. Please note where an individual CHO was unable to return the waiting list data for the month in question that is noted at the bottom of the waiting list table.

Please find the attached appendices which contain, in tabular form, details of the waiting lists in Podiatry. This is the reported data at the end of each year from 2018 to 2020 and for the year to date for September 2021. Where the waiting list table has a zero in every quarter, this means that while there is a service in that CHO area, the data is reported and combined with another CHO area.
