Re: PQ - 56636/21 - To ask the Minister for Health the average number of patients waiting for a hearing aid installation through the medical card scheme in County Meath by wait time intervals of 3, 6, 9, 12, and 18 months and over in each of the years 2015 to 2020 and to date in 2021, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter – Johnny Guirke

Dear Deputy Guirke,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and outlined the position as follows.

Unfortunately we are not in a position to provide the information requested in the format requested.

Meath audiology patients receive their care from the Audiology service in Grangegorman which is the location where clients from Dublin North City & County also receive services.

Activity records for Meath and Dublin North City and County are not separated and it is not possible to extract Meath audiology patients

The activity for the Grangegorman Audiology department is attached for your information.
