PQ 58096/21 * To ask the Minister for Health the number of instances of spiking of either physical spiking of a person, perhaps through syringe into a part of the body, or of spiking of a drink that have resulted in presentations at emergency departments in hospitals by hospital in tabular form; and the presenting symptoms of the patients to emergency departments in this regard.

Dear Deputy Lahart,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

I have enquired with the HSE Healthcare Pricing Office, who collect data through the Hospital In-Patient Enquiry (HIPE) system, which is the main national repository of inpatient and daycase information for acute public hospitals.

HIPE does not collect data from 'ED' only cases, non-acute care and out-patient clinics. HIPE collects data on patients who attended ED and were subsequently admitted to hospital.

HIPE have advised that they do not collect data on instances of spiking so are therefore unable to provide the information you have requested as it is not centrally available.

I trust this is of assistance.
