The current guidance on testing for COVID-19, including surveillance testing, is detailed in *Acute Hospital Infection Prevention and Control Precautions for Possible or Confirmed COVID-19 in a Pandemic Setting V2.7.03.12.2021*¹ which is available at the link below. This guidance is updated regularly in line with emerging evidence and data and provides guidance for management of patients in acute hospitals which is applied in the context of local risk assessment.
